
After Alcohol Prohibition ended, we got Drug Prohibition.

- Regulate and zone where and how drugs can be marketed, *including* alcohol and tobacco.
- Medicalize addictive drugs to reduce harm.
- Offer free treatment for addicts who request it.
- Work within your own community to effect change.
